

ALTERNATIVE STUDENT BREAKS

The 155 students who participated in Alternative Student Breaks completed 4,058 service hours on 11 domestic and abroad trips in seven states (Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Missouri, Tennessee, South Carolina, & North Carolina) and three countries (Dominican Republic, Ecuador & Nicaragua).

DANCE MARATHON

Each year AUDM engages the Auburn campus and local community in raising funds and generating awareness for Children's Miracle Network. Now in its sixth year, AUDM has raised more than \$1.5 million total for the Children's Miracle Network. In 2017, AUDM surpasses its \$500,000 goal and raised \$541,832 to directly benefit the Children's Hospital at Midtown Medical Center at Columbus Regional Health.

BEAT BAMA FOOD DRIVE

Auburn University won the 23rd Annual Beat Bama Food Drive raising 245,722 pounds of food for the East Alabama Food Bank compared to 150,322 raised by the University of Alabama.





IMPACT

IMPACT is Auburn University's central resource for volunteer opportunities and community service in the Auburn Community. IMPACT provides students with the opportunity to volunteer throughout the week and special one-time volunteer opportunities. Students can work around their schedules and select from various volunteer opportunities.

ORGANIZATIONAL SEATING PROGRAM

OSP is SGA's competitive, academic-incentive based system used to promote and determine reserved organizational seating at football games. All Auburn University chartered, permanent student organizations are encouraged to participate. Organizations' average Fall 2016 and Spring 2017 GPAs were used to establish rankings and determine seating for the Fall 2017 football season. More than 6,300 students representing 57 organizations participated in the Organizational Seating Program.

The Organizations Fund is available to active student organizations each year through the Student Organizations Student Activity Portfolio. The O-Fund can be used only by permanent student organizations.
